



- Address the health care needs of the uninsured low income population in a well-planned and efficient manner;
- Strengthen and expand community awareness and support for the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington; and
- Sustain a healthy organization.



The governing board is prepared to address external environmental changes through the formation of a new health care reform board committee. Our medical program will continue to focus on more immediate health care needs for the uninsured through the provision of urgent care services, vision care, immunizations, oral health and diabetes care. The dental program will increase clinic capacity to address the growing demand for

adult urgent dental care services and continue to address preventative services for children. The Project Access program will continue to coordinate specialty care with community providers. Expanding community awareness and support is also a focus for the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington. We will ensure that the infrastructure of our organization is strong and sustainable through the ongoing recruitment and retention of volunteers and staff who provide extraordinary care and service for our patients. And finally, we will continue to recruit highly committed board members to guide the organization into the future.

COMMUNITY-BASED HEALTH

MEDICAL PROGRAM

The Free Clinic of Southwest Washington medical program provides urgent health care services, vision assessments, health screenings (blood pressure, cholesterol, and glucose), children's immunizations, sports physicals, diabetes care, diagnostic ultrasounds and medication/prescription assistance to uninsured individuals in Southwest Washington.

In Clark County, over 13 percent of individuals have no health insurance - often due to job loss, the prohibitive cost of health insurance, or because the employer does not offer health insurance. Whatever the reason, many individuals without health insurance fear the cost of health care and often delay seeking help until their health condition becomes critical. The Free Clinic of Southwest Washington is able to offer much-needed services to individuals who might otherwise go untreated or seek care in the emergency room.

Medical Program Highlights

- There were 8,723 patient visits in the medical program during Fiscal Year 2010-11, which is an 8 percent decrease from FY 2009-10.
- A Diabetes program was initiated in July 2010. The program provides short-term
 care for diabetic patients in order to stabilize their medical condition provide
 information and tools that will facilitate long-term behavioral changes, improve their
 overall health outcome, and assist with referral to a primary care home. Grants from
 the Regence Foundation and Bank of America Foundation provided the "start-up"
 funding for the successful program.
- A computerized kiosk was installed for patients to sign up for food assistance, DSHS and other services
- A telederm program was initiated. Photos of patient skin disorders are sent to a volunteer dermatologist who reviews the images remotely and recommends treatment.

VOLUNTEERS

Thanks to the volunteers at the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington, thousands of patients receive much-needed health care that they might otherwise go without.

Volunteer Program Highlights

- Six hundred twenty eight volunteers, including 208 new volunteers, contributed 27,068 hours of care and service.
- Recruitment and outreach to local clinics and health care systems was expanded.
- Volunteers stated that 91 percent are satisfied or very satisfied with the volunteer program.
- Student education and training was provided through partnerships with 16 schools/agencies.

Medical Volunteers delivered quality services:

- 357 Urgent Care Volunteers
- 16 Diabetes Volunteers
- 13 Health Screening Volunteers
- 42 Immunization Volunteers
- 29 Vision Volunteers
- 84 Dispensary Volunteers

CARE FOR PEOPLE IN NEED

DENTAL PROGRAM

The Free Clinic of Southwest Washington Dental Program provides urgent and emergent care for children and adults. Services are provided in a mobile dental van that has two operatories with X-ray. The van travels to schools and special events to provide oral care, sealants, and education to children throughout Clark County and surrounding areas. Children can also receive restorative care and exams during dental appointments at the FCSW.

The FCSW also provides urgent dental services (fillings and extractions) to adults in Clark County. By receiving much-needed care through the dental program, individuals are able to return to work or school and become productive community members.

Dental Program Highlights

- There were 2,306 patient visits to the dental program during Fiscal Year 2010-11, which is a 12 percent increase over fiscal year 2009-10. Sixty-five percent of patients were children; 35 percent were adults.
- The mobile dental van traveled to 38 schools and 22 community events.
- Grant funds from the Community Foundation for Southwest Washington provided for a portable X-ray unit, defibrillator, and support for electronic dental records.
- Through a contractual partnership with Clark County Community Services, the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington is providing urgent dental clinics for veterans living in Clark County.

PROJECT ACCESS CLARK COUNTY PROGRAM

Project Access Clark County (PACC) is a program of the Free Clinic of Southwest Washington that coordinates donated specialty health care services for low-income, uninsured patients in Clark County. Project Access strives to remove the financial barriers to specialty health care for low-income uninsured members of our community and to provide a quantifiable and efficiently organized structure in which physicians and health systems can donate health care services to those in need.

Project Access Clark County Highlights

- Project Access enrolled 414 patients in FY 2010-11, which is an 8 percent increase over FY 2009-10.
- Two hundred eighty five participating specialists and four community health systems provided 1,529 appointments in FY 2010-11, an appointment increase of 2 percent over FY 2009-10.

86 volunteer dentists, hygienists, and assistants provided quality dental care to children and adults.
